Riverside Park, 20 acres of land bordering a quarter mile stretch of the mighty Missouri River on the south edge of the City, has been rejuvenated into an area of beauty offering recreational opportunities for all to enjoy.

With assistance from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the State of South Dakota, the James River Development District and many others, construction finally began in the fall of 1989 and the project was completed this spring of 1991.
